Call to Order: Cindy Gannon introduced herself and provided a brief background of her experiences in education as teacher and administrator.

Committee Establishment- During the last session during the Spring of 2023, a discussion established a Secretary as well as a Chairperson. Neither were present at this meeting (Brian Tisdall- Chairperson and Shaina Lampton- Secretary). Norms were established (general politeness, no side conversations,).

Standing Items and Quick Updates:

- Security and safety updates- personnel observed roaming the buildings, being proactive and visible at events; things were operating smoothly overall
- SMARTPASS System- adjustments continue as the school implements
- Performance Update- Karen discussed the fall testing- PSAT was online, and PSAT/ NMSQT to juniors; although there have been some issues with data collection and the initial implementation, response to the test has been positive and students continue to grow/improve;
- A new system called I-Ready has been introduced as a progress monitoring tool and placement measure; it does not test "advanced students" but does well for identifying struggling ones; a Math Lab was created this year as an intervention; Karen shared additional data

Community Engagement and Partnership:

- The student Services Team is new this year and is designed as an engagement with various Teller County organizations for referrals as needed
- Monday, January 22nd is Showcase Night- details TBD
- "Daily Announcements" were added to the IC system as a "push" to parents for communications
- As the district produces attendance letters, there has been some confusion (building and schools- elementary vs. middle vs. high)
- Some general conversation regarding the best way to communicate/engage with parents and with teachers; some messages get delivered; some don't and it causes simple confusion among all parties

Celebrations: There was much to celebrate

- O Soccer went to state, chosen to host a team,
- Cheer 3rd at state,

- Both XC teams competed at state. Top 10, and huge expectation for future successes
- o 4 students chosen All State Choir,
- o Caleb Keezor chosen at Thespian conference,
- Marching Band close to going to state,
- o swim program participation numbers increasing,
- o girls wrestling beat #5 in state- 4-5 each program looking like going to state.
- o 3 current staff about to graduate with Master's in Administration.
- Principals headed to San Antonio for the Marzano conference to receive HRS Level 1 award.
