VROOM TIP ~ CRITICAL THINKING

Hills and Rolling with Your Child

Find something to build a little hill, such as a piece of cardboard leaning against a chair? Find things to roll down the hill, like pens or pencils.

Ask your child to predict which things will go fast or slow. Then try it!

What do they notice? What other things can they find to roll?

BRAINY BACKGROUND

Your child is thinking like a scientist as they explore and come up with their own ideas about how things work and why. You're also encouraging them to try out different ideas to get more information. This kind of problem solving is an important life skill.

Activities this month focus on Cognitive Development

Cognitive Development includes your child's ability to think, remember, create, make logical decisions, problem-solve, and generalize. It is impacted by interactions, reactions, and experiences. and influenced by genes from parents and the environment in which a child grows.

Exposing your child to new eating, sensory, and life experiences, labeling emotions, and encouraging them to solve problems supports their cognitive development.
