Throughout the 1940s and '50s, Thurgood Marshall distinguished himself as one of the country's top lawyers. While he had many significant cases, perhaps his most notable success was as the lawyer who successfully argued *Brown v. Board of Education of Topeka*, before the U.S. Supreme Court in 1954. Thirteen years later Thurgood Marshall became the first African American to serve on the U.S. Supreme Court. He was officially nominated by President Lyndon B. Johnson and confirmed by the U.S. Senate in 1967, he served as a justice until 1991.
