Capstone projects reflect real-life application and critical thinking skills in each area of study.

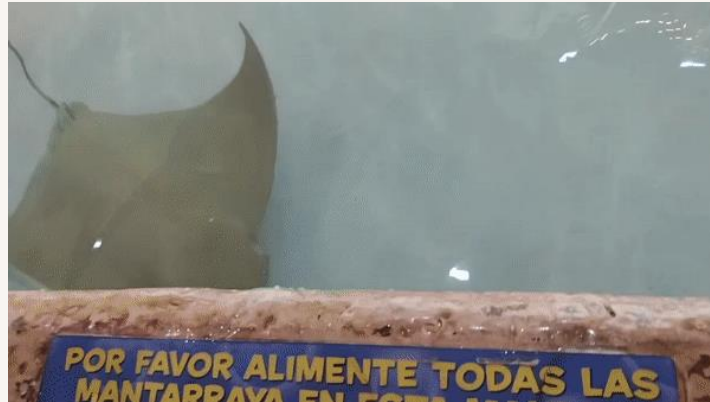
SERVICES
