This new protocol will replace the ALICE (Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, Evacuate) method previously employed in our district.

The "I Love U Guys" SRP is a comprehensive and widely recognized approach to emergency response that focuses on clear communication, consistent terminology, and well-defined actions during various emergency situations. Schools and organizations nationwide have embraced this protocol for its simplicity, effectiveness, and emphasis on the safety and well-being of everyone involved.

Key features of the "I Love U Guys" SRP include:

Standardized Language: The protocol uses consistent, easy-to-understand language to ensure everyone knows what actions to take during emergencies.

Immediate Response: The protocol empowers individuals to take appropriate actions without confusion or delay, helping to minimize risk and enhance safety.
